

Scene Types – Overview

1. Introduction Scene

- Introduces characters, places, or situations.
- Provides necessary information for the beginning.
- Builds initial expectations.

2. Conflict Scene

- Brings characters into confrontation (internal or external).
- Drives the story through tension and friction.
- Often the engine of the narrative.

3. Revelation Scene

- Hidden information, secrets, or truths are revealed.
- Can be small (a detail becomes clear) or big (a plot twist).
- Changes the perspective of the reader or characters.

4. Turning Point Scene

- Shifts the story into a new direction.
- Often leads to decisions or changed goals.
- Usually crucial for what follows.

5. Climax Scene

- The most dramatic moment of a story arc.
- The biggest conflict, the most intense confrontation.
- Emotionally or action-packed.

6. Resolution Scene

- Conflicts are resolved or fade into the background.
- Characters and readers gain clarity.
- Provides a transition to the next development.
